The first and last letters of the Bible point to Jesus

- ◆ The first two letters of the Bible spell בראשית in Gen 1:1).¬ב means "son" (see Psa 2:12)
- ◆ The first letter of the Bible is □.
- ◆ The last letter of the Bible is N in Greek.

There are three alternative endings for Rev 22:21 –

- (a) "The grace of the Lord Jesus be with the saints." $~\mu\epsilon\tau\alpha~\alpha\gamma$ ion (META AGION)
- (b) "... be with all." μετα παντων (ΜΕΤΑ ΠΑΝΤΩ \mathbf{N})
- (c) "... be with all, Amen." μετα παντων, $Αμην (ΜΕΤΑ ΠΑΝΤΩΝ ΑΜΗ<math>\underline{\bf N}$) In every case the last letter is N.

There is no confusion in relating this to the Hebrew letter 1. In the order of the alphabets:

Hebrew:	Kaf	Lamed	Mem	Nun
Greek:	Карра	Lamda	Me	Nee
Numeric values (in both alphabets):	20	30	40	50

So we may say the first and last letters of the Bible spell:

Jesus is the Son of God (Luke 1:35)

Jesus is the Son of man (Matt 9:6)
